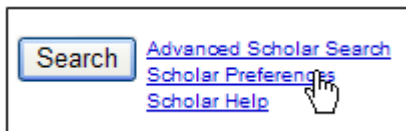


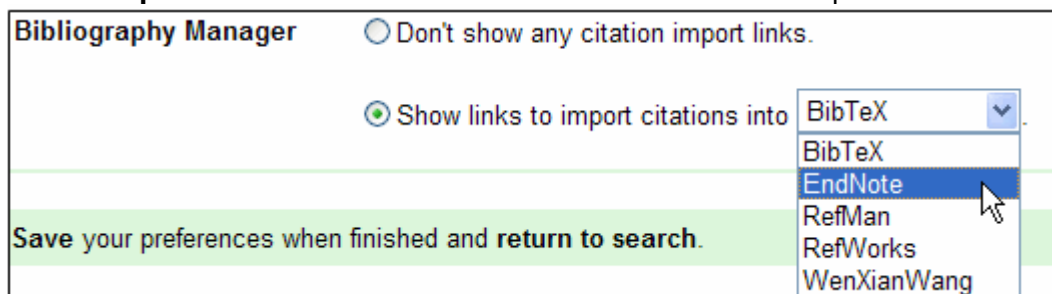
Importing Citations from Google Scholar



1. Open the Google Scholar website: <http://scholar.google.com>
2. Click **Scholar Preferences**.



3. Scroll to the bottom of the page. In the Bibliography Manager section, choose the **Show link to import** radio button and choose **EndNote** from the drop-down box.

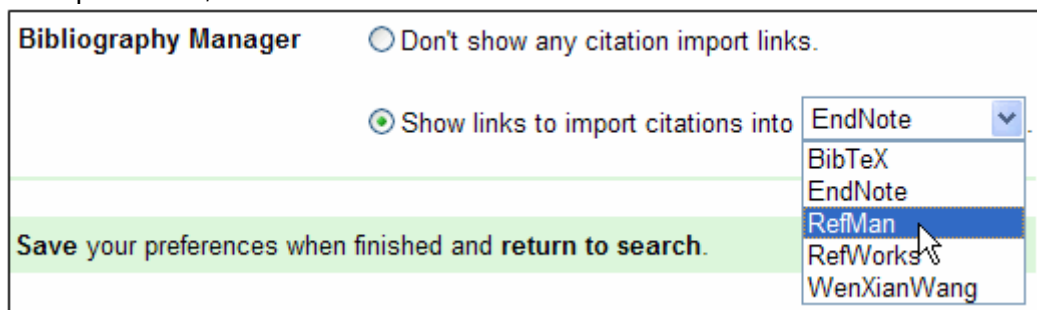


4. Click **Save Preferences**.
5. When you run a search in Google Scholar, you will now see an **Import into EndNote** option with each citation. Click this link to import the citation.



Importing Citations Into EndNote Web

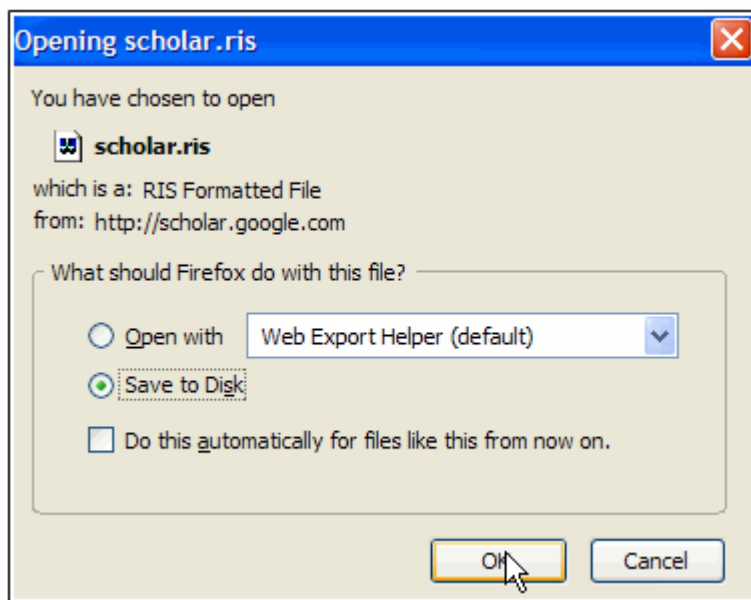
1. At step 3 above, choose **RefMan**.



- Click **Save Preferences**.
- When you run a search in Google Scholar, you will now see an **Import into RefMan** option with each citation. Click this link to save the citation.



- Choose the **Save to Disk** radio button and click **Save**. *Note:* This option does not always work in Internet Explorer. If you run into problems, search Google Scholar using the Firefox browser.



- Within EndNote Web, click the **Import** tab.



Click the **Import Reference** link.



- Click the Browse button and find the file you saved from Google Scholar (usually saved to the computer desktop or My Documents folder).
