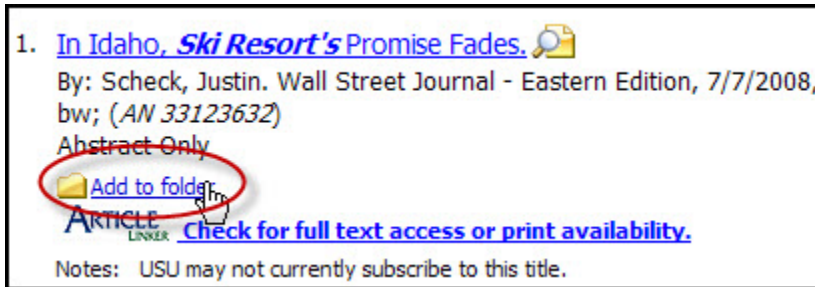


Importing Citations From Ebsco Databases

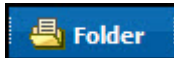


Importing Citations into EndNote X

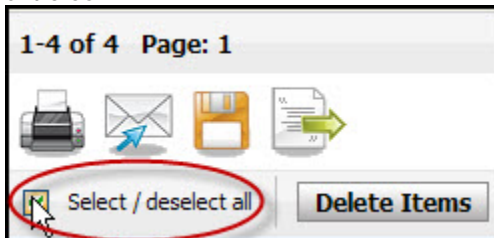
1. Conduct your search in any database provided by Ebsco.
2. For each citation you want to send to EndNote, click the **Add** button to the right of the citation.



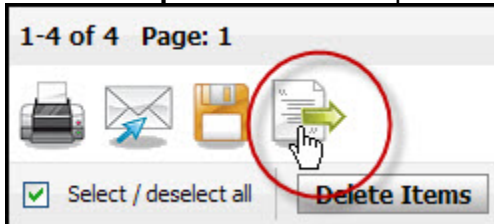
3. Click **Folder Has Items** at the top of the page.



4. Click the **Select/deselect all** checkbox at the top of the page to select your articles.



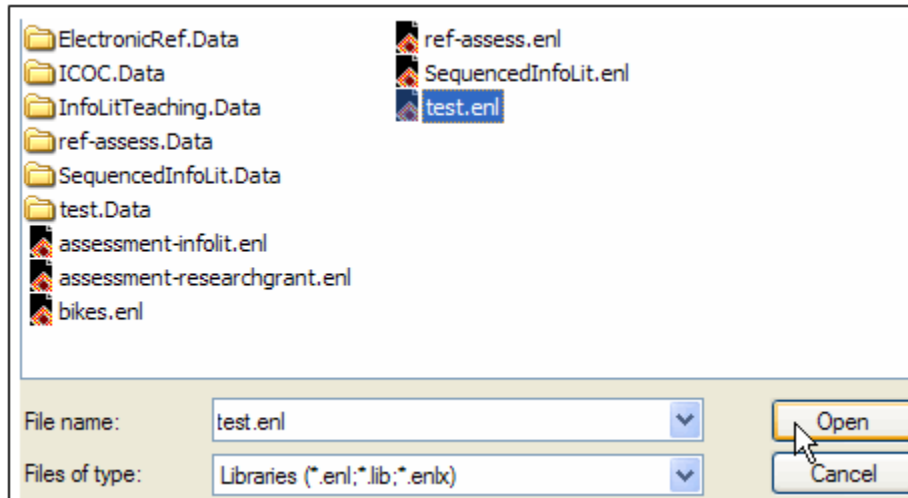
5. Click the **Export** link at the top of the page.



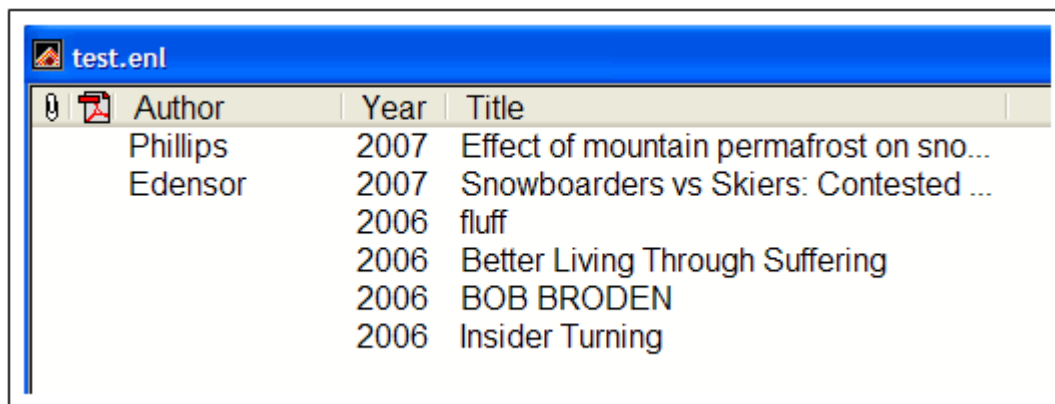
6. Uncheck the box next to **Remove these items from folder....** Choose the **Direct Export to EndNote, ProCite or Reference Manager** radio button.



7. Click **Save**.
8. EndNote X will open. Choose the library in which you want to save your citations. If you don't see your list of libraries, browse to the location where your libraries are saved.



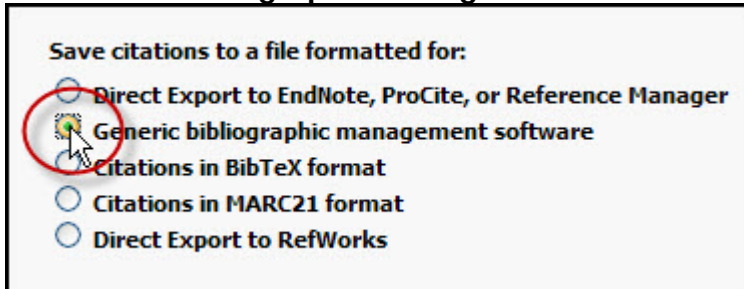
9. Click **Open**. You should see a list of the citations you imported. To view all the citations in the library, click **References** on the EndNote menu bar and choose **Show All References**.



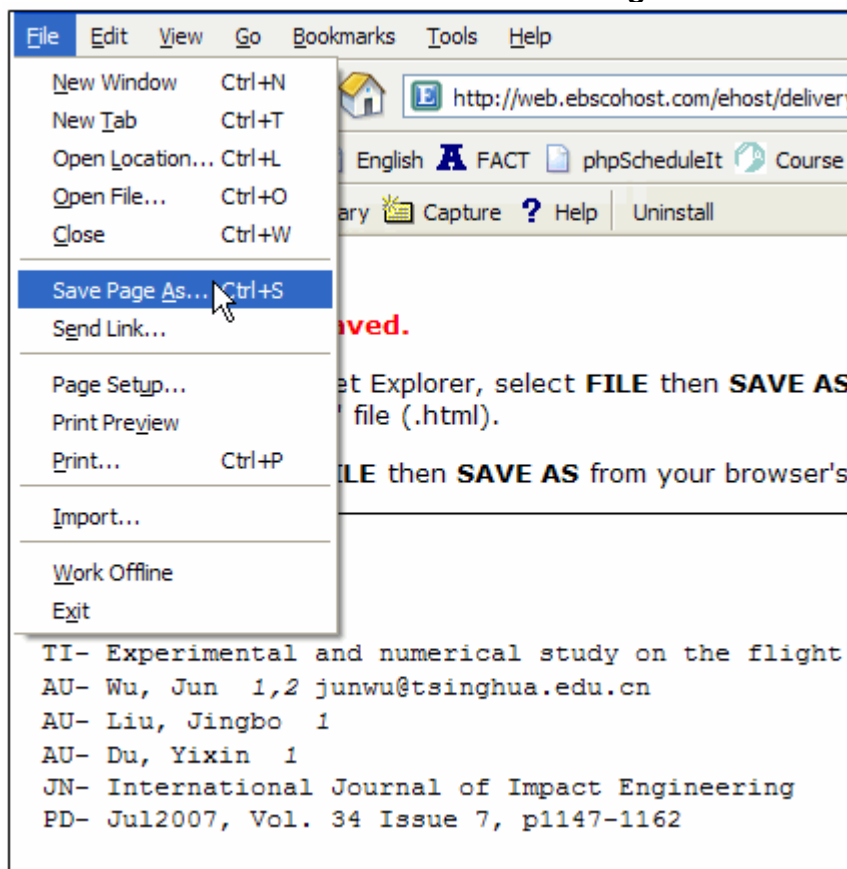

Importing Citations into EndNote Web

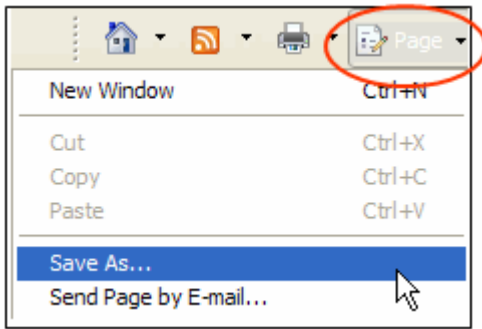
1. Complete the instruction above through step 4 above.
2. At step 5, uncheck the box next to **Remove these items from folder....** Choose the **Generic bibliographic management software** radio button.



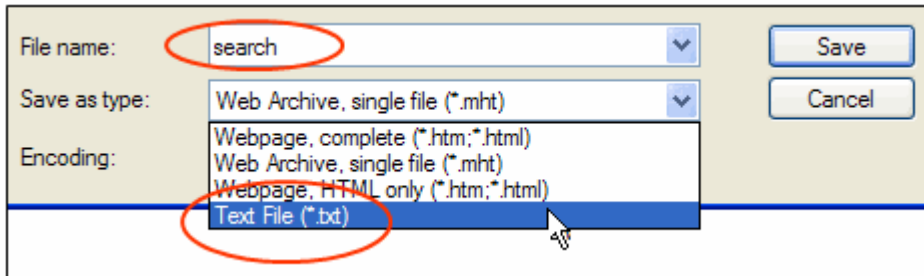
3. Click **Save**.
4. Click **File** on the Menu bar and choose **Save Page As**.



For Internet Explorer 7, click **Page** on the menu bar and choose **Save As...**



5. Leave the default file name or change the name to one of your choosing.



6. In the **Save as type** drop-down box, choose **Text File**.

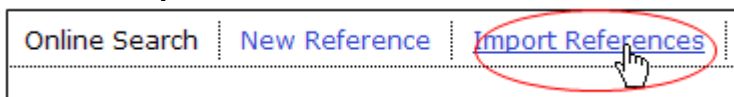
7. Click **Save**.

8. Open your EndNote Web.

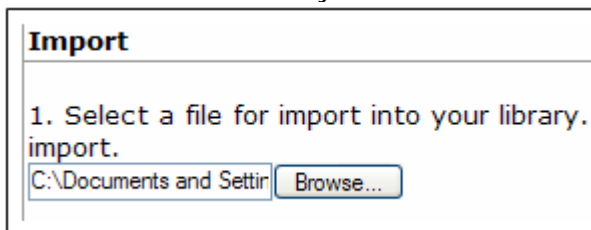
9. Click the **Collect** tab.



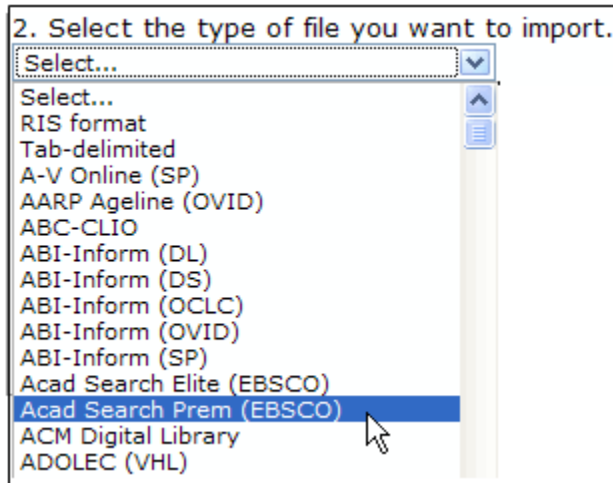
10. Click the **Import References** link.



11. Browse to the file which you saved from the Ebsco database.



12. Choose the file matching the Ebsco database you were searching. In this example, the database was Academic Search Premier.



13. Click **Import**. Your citations will be imported into the Unfiled folder.
