Workshop: Put the Sharing In Your Data Management and Sharing Plan

This is the year! All Federal agencies that distribute significant research grant funding have until the end of 2025 to issue new policies requiring the public sharing of research data. Many have already done so, creating a confusing patchwork of rules you must navigate if you are developing a new grant proposal.

This Workshop Will:

- Update you on recent changes at the agencies that most commonly work with USU researchers
- Help you strategize when you start a new project to gather and format your data to most easily comply with sharing requirements
- Review support provided by USU Libraries to help you create your DMSP, including how to use DMPTool and get expert guidance on finding the best home for your data

- **Monday, February 10th, 2:30-3:45 PM | LIB 208 | *Making Your Data Sing: Data Sonification for Beginners***

Data sonification is a form of data representation that uses sounds varying in pitch, volume, or length to illustrate a dataset. Like data visualization it allows us to quickly interpret what the data is telling us. Data sonification also adds another layer of accessibility to data visualization. This workshop will introduce participants to data sonification, discuss best practices, and introduce them to data sonification tools. Presented by McGill University.
